

Play Pathfinder Overview

In April 2008 Cambridgeshire County Council was selected to become a 'Play Pathfinder'. The DCSF has awarded Cambridgeshire a capital fund, which is to be spent over the next two years and a revenue fund to be spent over the next three years.

There are two main project strands to the Play Pathfinder:

- **Build an adventure playground**
- **Develop or redevelop 28 play spaces**

Approximately half the revenue and capital funding will go towards the building of an adventure playground in the Waterlees Ward (also known as the Spinney) in Wisbech which is targeted towards children aged 8-13. The neighbourhood management programme Fenland Links has already carried out 'Planning for Real' consultation with the community, and activities for children and young people came out as the second most important priority aspect for improvement in the area.

The adventure playground will be developed with the community and a number of partner agencies including: Fenland District Council, Roddon's, The Oasis Centre and The Ormiston Trust, through meaningful consultation and participation throughout. Children and young people will be involved in researching similar provision so they can make informed choices about the design of the playground. Children will be able to access the staffed provision free of charge on an open access basis. Fenland District Council are also proposing a football pitch to be sited next to the adventure playground and this will be included in the consultation (although this will be in the second phase of the project and may not correspond with the opening of the adventure playground).

The construction of the adventure playground is due to start mid 2009 and planned completion is early 2010.

We provide transport to & from the day centre. We also provide a traditional home cooked meal & refreshments throughout the day.

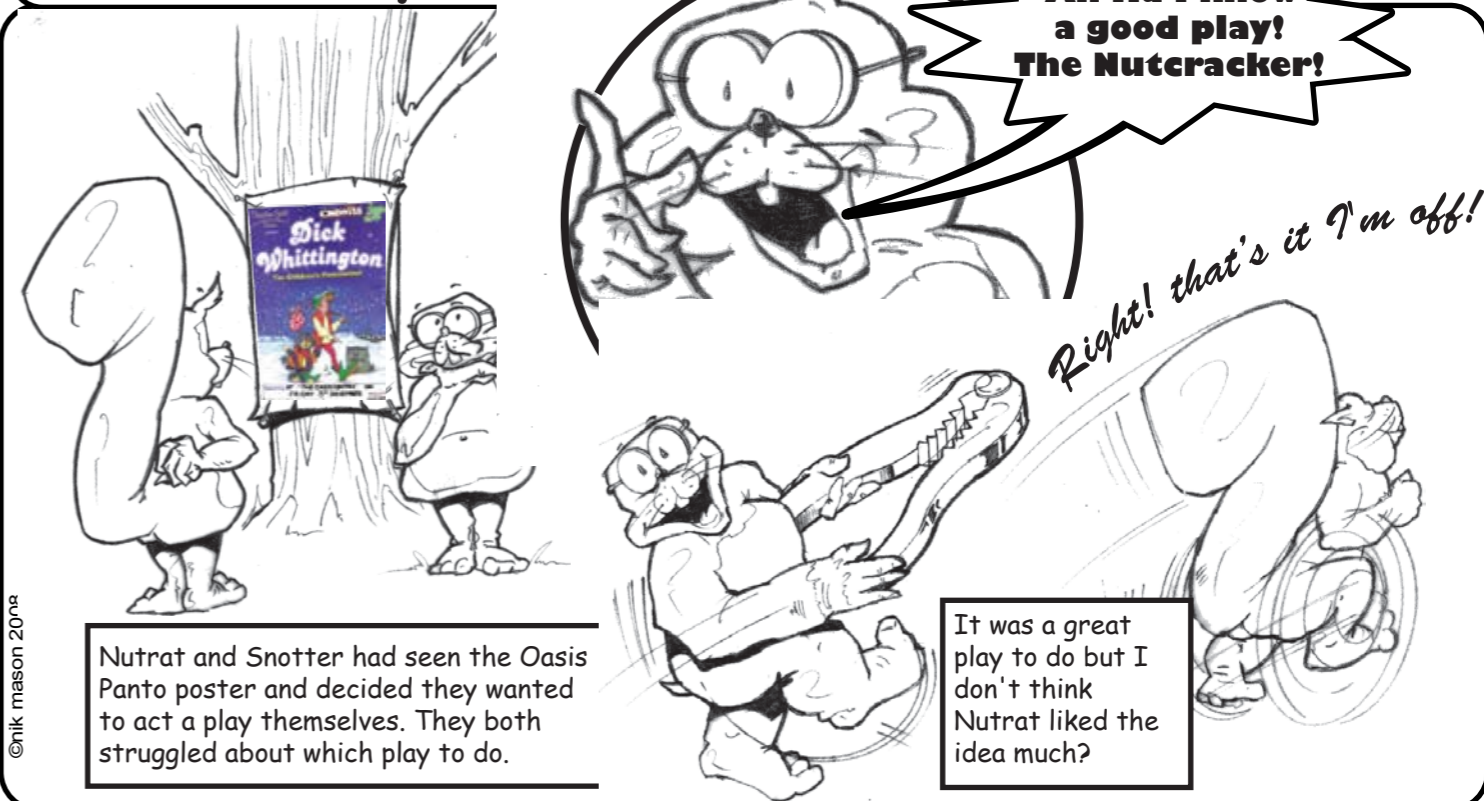
The Oasis Day centre is open three days a week Wednesday, Thursday & Friday from 9am - 3pm.
