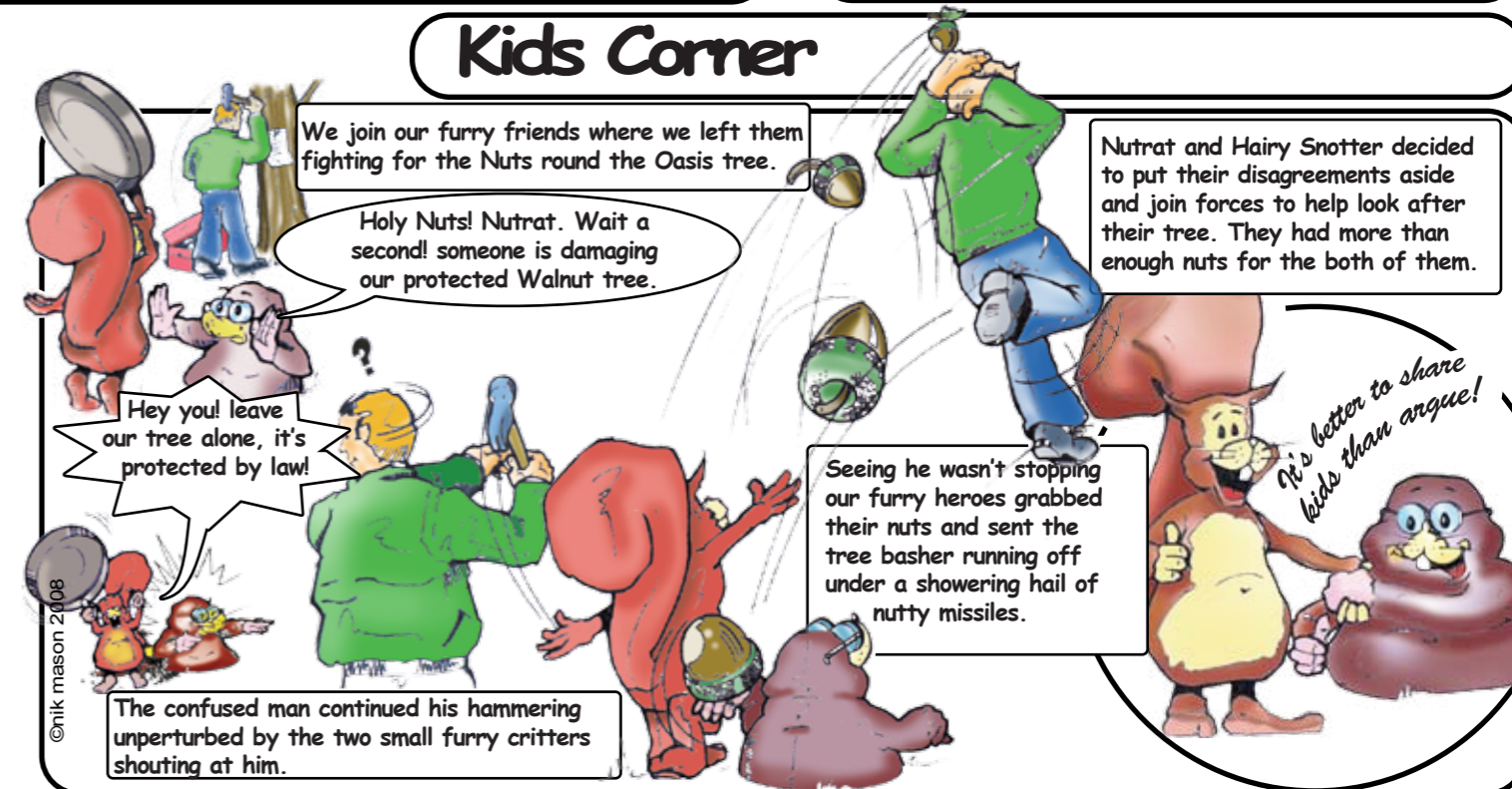
## Nutrat Raises Money for the Stroke Association.
